I am Bonnie Berry and my husband, and I have been Peru District residents for almost 40 years. My son and daughter were graduates of Peru Central School and now live in the district with their families. My four grandchildren attend Peru Middle School and High School.

I graduated from SUNY Plattsburgh in 1969 with a Bachelors Degree in Elementary Education and N-9 Mathematics and began my career at Peru Intermediate School as a fifth grade teacher starting that September. I went on to receive a Masters Degree and a certification in Literacy as well as a CAS in Administration.

I retired in 2006 but was back to work in September of that year as the assistant principal at the Peru secondary school until February. I also began work for CVES as a trainer facilitator with the assessment coordinator on data analysis and curriculum mapping and a short time as the Tobacco Program coordinator to complete the grant. I have substituted as both the Elementary and HS principal at NAC and principal and Director at CVES Special Education Division.

In 2011, NYS received the Race To The Top grant and I became a member of the North Country Network team and participated in the NYSED training in Albany on the deliverables of Data Driven Instruction, Common Core and APPR. I have visited schools and trained staff and administrators across the North Country. I continue my learning with workshops offered by New York State School Boards Association and Rural Schools Association.

I bring a vast amount of knowledge of current educational issues and varied experiences to the board as well as a strong work ethic and a person not afraid of the challenge.
